Mayor Roy Edgington called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm at Fernley City Hall, 595 Silver Lace Blvd, Fernley, NV.

Daphne Hooper City Manager said there will be quarterly meetings for the neighborhood watch with safety presentations given by Public Safety entities. The meeting on January 13th at 6 pm will be held in the council chambers with Lyon County SherriFF's office presenting. The citizens academy will begin Thursday January 20th running every Thursday until March 3rd from 6 to 8 PM. Covid walk-in clinic will be held Tuesday, January 25th from 3 to 4 pm. Masks are still required in City Hall. The Nevada Arts Council Traveling exhibit is in the City Hall Lobby called transformers reshaping form and meaning and will be on display until February 11th. January 3rd to January 15th the city will be accepting natural Christmas trees for free recycling at out-of-town park from 7 am to 2:30 pm. You can contact Public Works at 784 9914. City Hall will be closed for Martin Luther King Day.

Billy Staten Building Official said there were a total of 61 applications submitted which included 15 new single-family dwellings and 1 commercial structure. There were 35 miscellaneous residential, 1 new single-family dwelling and 4 new commercial structures. Total value of all permits was estimated as \$7,364,994. Inspectors completed 104 building inspections and 2 business license inspections. Code enforcement officers received 26 complaints last month with 21 abated and 5 still in process. 10 vehicles were tagged with 7 towed and 3 got moved. 86 vehicles in total for the calendar year. The

customer service techs received 209 phone calls related to land use or building inquiries and we assisted 315 customers at the counter.

Tim Thompson Planning Director explained Bill #304 is to change the zoning from C2 and GR20 to I – industrial, on a site that is about 78.86 acres in size. The parcel is located on Commerce Center Drive.

Councilwoman Zoberski asked if changing the zoning in that area would limit commercial business growth in that area of town.

Kim Swanson City Clerk referred to map to explain the changing ward boundaries and introduced the Lyon Clerk Niki Bryan on stand-by for questions. She explained a section from Ward 2 into Ward 1 and another section from Ward 5 is moving to Ward 4.

Public Input

Valerie Wilberts Fernley Resident lives in Felicity's Ward that is proposed to be moved into Mr. Lacy's Ward. She expressed displeasure about the change. She was concerned the change was only proposed because it was the easiest option.

8. STAFF REPORTS

8.1. 6:00P.M. (For possible action) Presentation and discussion of a vicious dog declaration in which the owner seeks to appeal.

Point of Order: This an administrative hearing of appeal of the animal control officer's decision. The mayor acted as the presiding officer of the hearing.

RanDee Gahr Animal Control Officer for the city of Fernley explained the hearing is about a vicious dog declaration from the Animal Control Officer in November of 2021. The incident occurred Nov 27th, 2021, at a residence during a Thanksgiving gathering where a 4-year-old boy was seriously injured. Adults were seated at a dinner table in the corner of the room with children separate from the adults' table. The victim

approached his mother at the table and asked about dessert then a growl was heard at the desert table followed by the child's screams. He had sustained a serious bite injury to his face and the dog owners promptly called 911. The dog was impounded by Animal Control on Nov. 30th and remained pending the outcome of this hearing. She presented photos of the injuries on screen. Emergency plastic surgery was conducted on the child. Tissue was missing from the child's lips. There was significant swelling and bruising following the incident. She noted that the dog in question was not cornered when the incident occurred, though the dog did not try to leave. She then listed warning behaviors a dog would exhibit when threatened with biting being last resort. There is also a bite scale from 1 to 6 with the extreme being fatality. This bite is a level 4 where over half of the canines have punctured the skin. Level 4 bites can be lethal to children. His forehead injuries are a level 2. The dog was noted to be aggressive at the Veterinarian's office that prevented the completion of yearly exams. Vet staff noted quick and aggressive mood swings without cause. Fernley Municipal code 610A3 states that the Animal Control Officer can declare a dog vicious if there is substantial bodily harm or if a human life has been put at risk. The child reportedly continues to feel pain around the injury 30 days post treatment. The wound took 10 days to close. A dog that bites in this manner shows a reduced bite inhibition which increases the likelihood that the dog will bite again. She determined this is a dangerous animal capable of inflicting serious injury to children.

Councilman Albert Torres asked if there was provocation to which Animal Control Officer RanDee Gahr responded that no one present actually witnessed the bite. He asked about incidents cited in her report where the owner's feel the dog was provoked prior to the incident however as no one saw the incident in question Randi maintained that there was no proof of provocation.

Councilwoman Felicity Zoberski asked if the staff responsible for the dog during quarantine reported any behavioral issues. RanDee responded that staff were notified of the potentially aggressive nature of the dog and therefore took proper precautions and did not report any incidents.

Brandon Leeks father of the child said that his son has been around dogs his whole life and never had any issues before this incident. He doesn't think his son would provoke an animal. He described the difficulties of the entire process at the hospital and conveyed the trauma and pain his family went through. He acknowledged this is difficult for the pet owner as well but does not want this to happen to another child. He compared his son's injuries to having a cleft lip and the difficulties he will face moving forward.

Elizabeth Leeks stepmother of the child expressed that they have several dogs at home including a litter of puppies which the child has never provoked.

Sean Bloom professor at TMCC and dog owner said he knows his dog Buddy bit the child, but he does not want his dog put down. He asked that his dog be deemed dangerous rather than vicious to abide by those guidelines of Nevada. He does not believe the child required emergency surgery. He remembers asking the child several times not to put his fingers in the bird cage and saw the child repeatedly step on the dog's tail and the dog didn't react. Both of his dogs were playing with the child earlier in the evening. When they brought out dessert the child wandered to the buffet table and Sean saw his dog staring towards the table, wagging his tail. He proposed that perhaps the dog was lunging for food the child could have been holding. He believes the incident is an accident which the dog is not responsible for. Sean mentioned the child could have accidentally provoked the dog with food not realizing what could happen. He also said the dog immediately released the child and ran to him, the owner. He said that the child is covered under his insurance policy for whatever procedure he might need until he is 18 so he shouldn't have to live with this permanently. He noted his dog only became aggressive at the vet's office when his temperature was taken.

A 4-minute Recess was taken at 6:52 PM

Theresa Bloom, Sean's Wife and hospice care nurse, said the definition of surgery in this case involved sedation and stitches because the boy is young, but it was not a formal surgery. She also said that the day the incident happened the child's mother told her she noticed her son bothers the animals and she thinks it's a problem for him.

Laurie Tibbins guest at the party said that on a couple of occasions she had reprimanded the boys several time to leave the bird alone which the boy in question would simply laugh and ignore her. She had also asked him not to aggravate the dogs on multiple occasions and stop stepping on their tails. She said the dog is a good dog.

Adele Panning, Buddy's groomer, said she had been grooming him since 2018 and never saw aggression from that dog through all the washing and tugging. She said no one saw what happened and doesn't think the dog should be put down but she thinks it was likely the dog was provoked.

Ann Bloom, Sean's mother, she said on the day when the incident occurred the child stepped on the dog's tail and smirked when she asked him not to, but Buddy did not react. Then the child did it again higher up the tail, laughed and ran away.

RanDee Gahr Animal Control Officer said the owner's testimony is speculative as no one was present when the child was bitten. The child was permanently disfigured and required an emergency procedure which meets the requirement of bodily harm of a vicious dog. She also said if in fact the dog was grabbing for food near the child's face, there should not have been as much force behind it rip tissue from a human's face. NRS 0.6060 says that substantial bodily harm has occurred, or loss of function occurs Animal Control may deem a dog as vicious. The dog could have left the child and had freedom of movement but decided not to. The child will require additional medical procedures, whether they are covered by insurance or not, and will be reminded of the pain of that night. We seek to keep the vicious dog declaration upheld as there is no evidence of provocation.

Councilman Albert Torres acknowledges that the dog did damage enough to incur NRS 0.6060 but maintained that there is no proof of provocation or not which leaves the latter part of that code that says "without provocation" was not showed in this case to be declared a vicious dog.

Aaron Mouritsen Deputy City Attorney clarified that under section 6.10 provocation must be proven, not disproven, to negate the declaration of a dangerous animal.

Sean Bloom dog owner said he knows his dog bit the child but reiterates that the child has a history of being rough with the animals. He maintains that his dog was going after food and thinks his dog should be declared dangerous not vicious.

RanDee Gahr Animal Control Officer explained a dangerous animal permit requires that the dog is contained to the property with exception of going to the vet or groomer and other locations of that nature. The dog must be leashed at all times and placed in a muzzle. There has to be a \$50,000 insurance policy on the dog in the event of future injuries for the lifetime of the dog, which would be checked periodically by Animal Control to ensure the policy is current. The enclosure will have to be approved by Animal Control and the existing dog run is not in compliance with the dangerous animal enclosure. If the dog is moved it must be under the consent of Animal Control and in previous cases Animal Control does not want any person under the age of 18 around the dog without the animal being leashed and muzzled at all times. There must be a roof and appropriate shelter in the enclosure. The dog must be licensed with Animal Control as well for a dangerous dog permit. In previous cases we have approved kennels of 10 x 10 chain link enclosure with a roof and shelter.

Motion: MOVE TO OVERTURN THE VICIOUS DOG DECLARATION ZONED BY ANIMAL CONTROL ON NOVEMBER 30TH, 2021 AND REQUIRE THAT SEAN AND THERESEA BLOOM MAY REGAIN CUSTODY OF BUDDY AFTER SUCCESSFULLY FULFILLING THE CONDITIONS OF THE DANGEROUS DOG PERMIT AND SHOULD THERE BE A PROBLEM, ANY VIOLATION OF THE DANGEROUS DOG PERMIT, THE DOG WOULD BE EUTHANIZED WITH NO QUESTION ON ANYBODY'S PART. DISCRETION TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER TO CREATE THE ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS REQUESTED. **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Councilwoman McKay, **Seconded by** Councilman Lacy. **Vote:** Motion carried by unanimous roll call vote (**summary:** Yes = 4, No = 1). **Yes:** Councilman Albert Torres, Councilman Ray Lacy, Councilwoman Fran McKay, Councilwoman Felicity Zoberski, Councilman Stan Lau.

9. ADDRESS REQUEST(S) FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS.

NRS 365.550 Section 8 (a)(b) states the following:

“Each county and incorporated city shall, not later than March 1 of each year, submit a list to the Department of Transportation setting forth:

- (a) Each improved road or street that is maintained by the county or city; and
- (b) The beginning and ending points and the total mileage of each of those improved roads or streets.

Each county and incorporated city shall, at least 10 days before the list is submitted to the Department of Transportation, hold a public hearing to identify and determine the improved roads and streets maintained by the county or city.”

The City has a database of roads and streets within the City that is updated as projects are completed. This database, along with required NDOT Forms (Attachment No. 1 and Attachment No. 2, below), will be submitted to NDOT subsequent to Council approval.

Per NRS 365.550, every 10 years NDOT is required to perform a physical road audit of the roads maintained by the City for Motor Fuel Tax purposes. This audit was most recently completed by NDOT Roadway Systems Division in Fall 2015. In General, NDOT evaluates total centerline mileage included within the City’s Corporate Boundary, and compares their audit totals to certified mileage totals as submitted by the City.

If the total mileage obtained by NDOT after an audit is within 5% of the mileage submitted by the City, the City’s mileage is accepted by the State without any major revisions necessary, and the higher mileage amount is assigned to the City. The City’s certified mileage amount was within the required 5%, however, the total mileage driven by NDOT exceeded the total mileage submitted by the City. As a result, in 2016 the City’s new certified mileage became 129.202; (total centerline mileage derived through NDOT’s audit in Fall, 2015) a slight increase from 128.72 miles, reported in recent years preceding the audit.

A total of 0.855 Additional Roadway Centerline Miles were accepted by the City during Data Year 2019.

No additional centerline miles of public roadway were accepted by the City for the 2020 Data Year.

No centerline miles have changed classification during the 2021 Data Year. The total area managed by the City within the corporate boundary map has not changed during the 2021 Data Year.

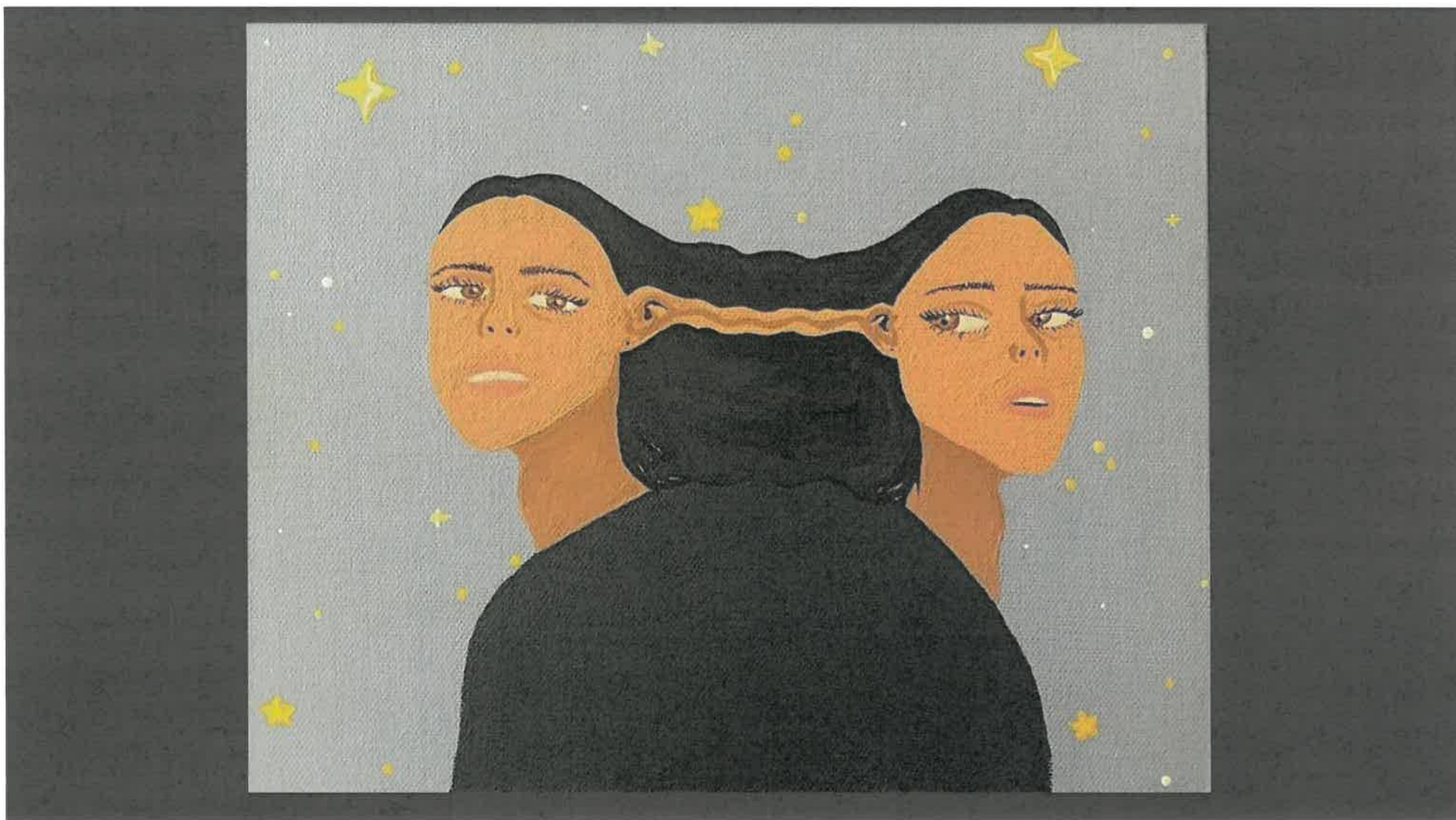

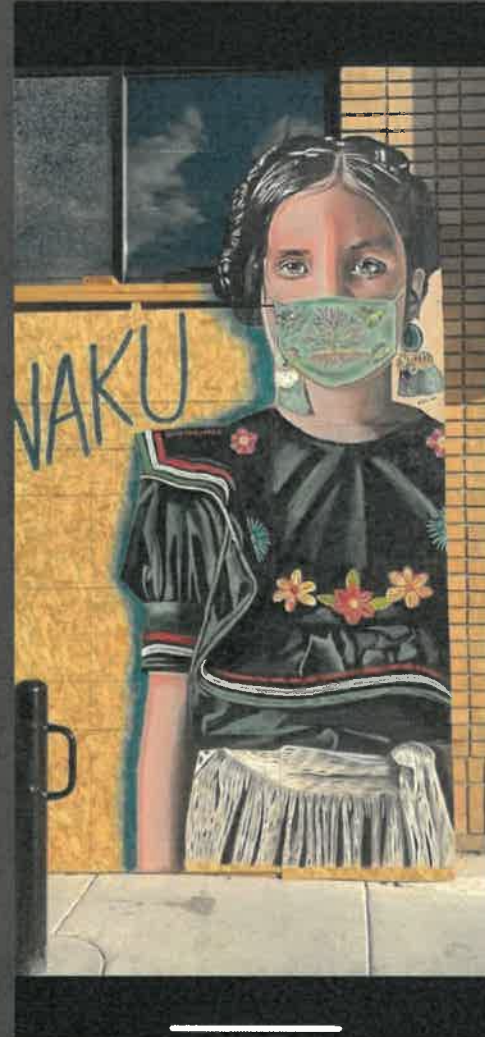




Edwin Martinez Escobar - Reno, NV

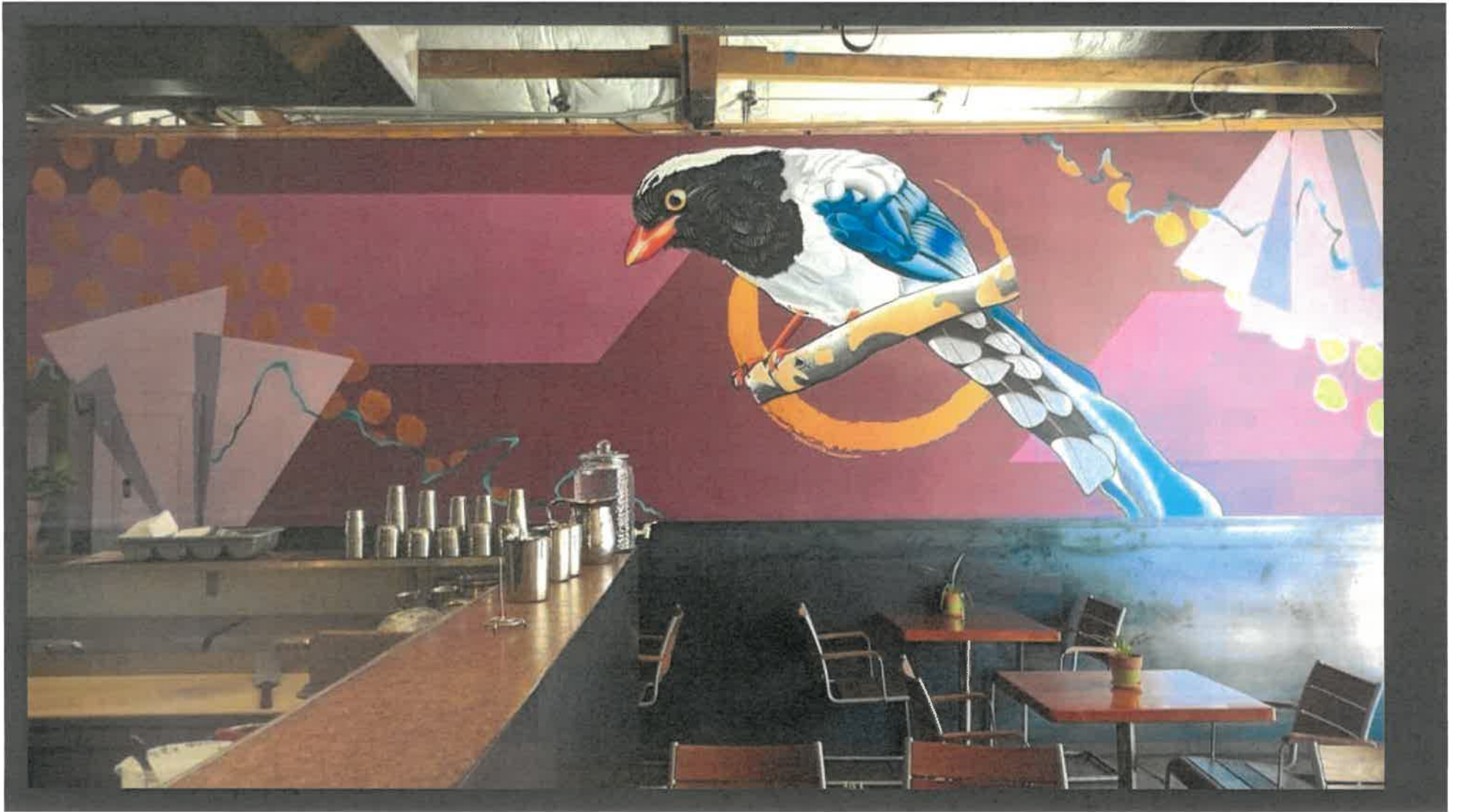

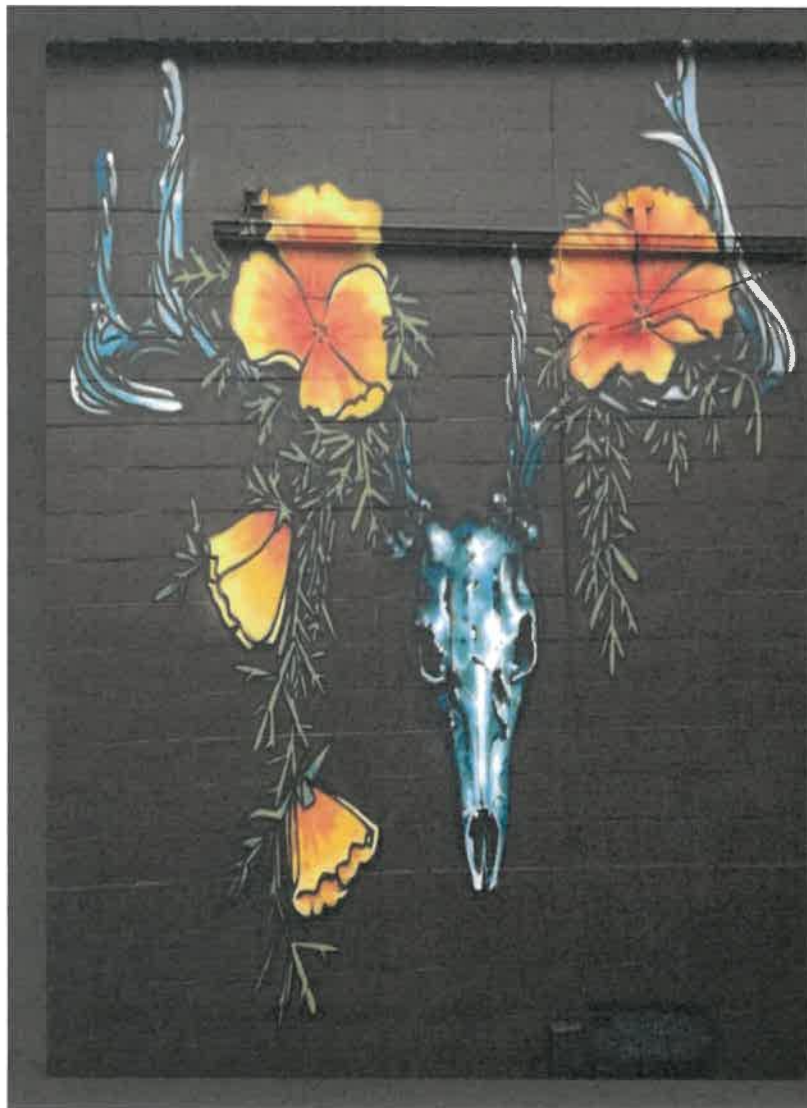

Retrovisuality, tactility, warmth. this is how one can characterize the work of an artist who has been keen on collage for the last few years in his work. The artist's approach to composition becomes kinesthetic when, instead of graphics programs on a tablet or computer, he focuses on working with paper, scraps of magazines, postcards and newspapers, which are carefully collected. As a result of his work, Vasyabasyo strives to create a mural or a small street drawing or a drawing on canvas, the sketch for which is always a collage. In Vasily's artistic method, collage plays a primary role and we can say that to some extent it is a fragment of memories, a reflection of the inner state and a translation of the author's concept of the beautiful and graceful. using collage and introducing it into the street environment, the artist shows his vision of muralism, street art and graffiti

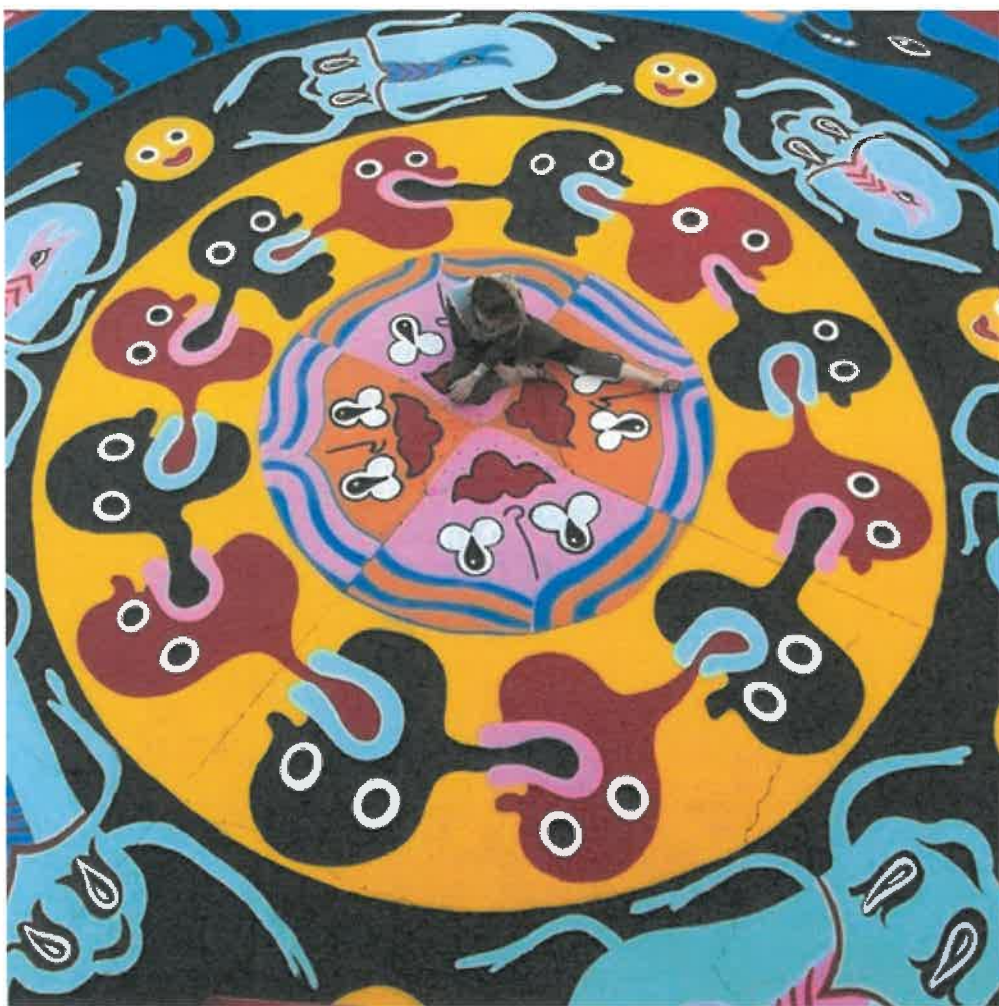

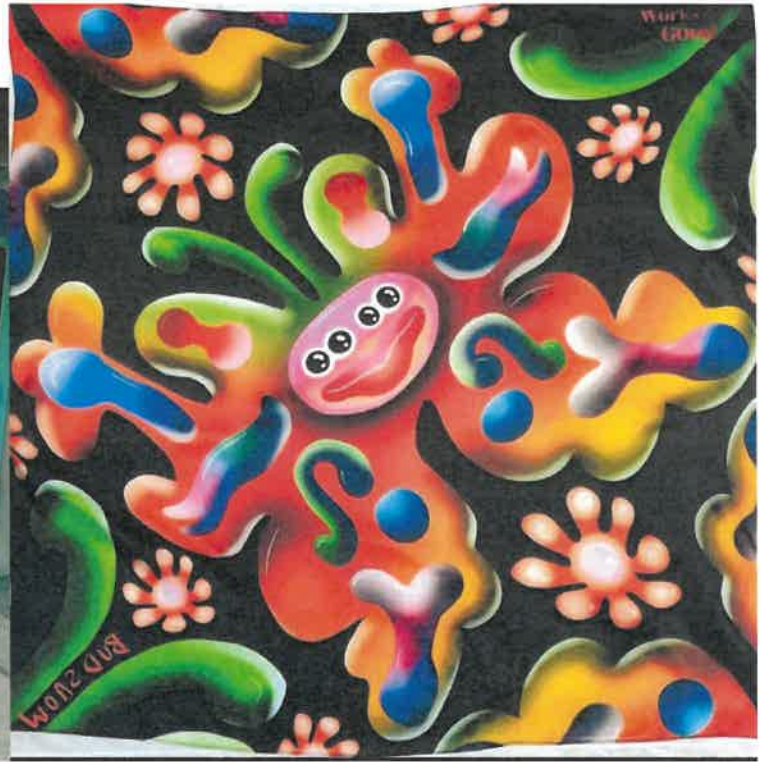

As a young person, traveling with a small circus, performing with fire, on stilts, and inside puppets *gave me a freedom of expression that got into my bones...* An artist, stilt walking father would take young Bud on annual road trips to Camp Winnarainbow, Wavy Gravy's infamous circus camp in Northern California. Here, Bud picked up further awareness of costume and performance literacy.

Likewise, under the wing of a Canadian painter mother, Bud has watched the act of Painting, with some attention, for over 25 cognicent years. It's no wonder that finding Character through mark making, would come in handy later in life.

In both my parents I noticed a daily attention to their craft that seemed liberating. They taught me by example.

I've been toying with the term Neo-Primalism...a school of work I associate with automatism in community space. Intuitive painting, photography, and installation as direct response to the ample ironies and absurdities of living. I'm concerned with Humanism, Animalism, Neo-Primalism. I work with a medium format rangefinder, a spray can, and a paintbrush. I like to work outside.

An ambitious creative with roots in Minneapolis, Jennifer Charboneau completed her Fine Arts degree in 2008 and traveled to 21 different countries living as a nomadic artist for over 10 years. The creative energy in Reno-Tahoe, the expansive landscapes to explore, and events like Burning Man, have inspired her to make Reno home while not on the road.

Inspired by travel and exploration of new places and social environments Charboneau's work typically reflects subtle observations of people, landscapes, and social dialog. What begins as chaotic pen sketches and captured moments in prose, later become refined gestural abstractions of form and movement. These 'Visual Philosophies' enlighten the eye with bold chaotic brushstrokes while an intentional vagueness of form and space allows the subjective experience to be relative to all.

Some muses that influence Charboneau's artwork across all borders are: impressionism, expressionism, street art, nature, philosophy, jazz, haiku & prose poetry, and people ~~and~~ social anthropology.

She is a visual philosopher who is out to absorb all that this life has to show... then spit it out onto canvas and paper as chaotically and yet beautifully as it was first observed.

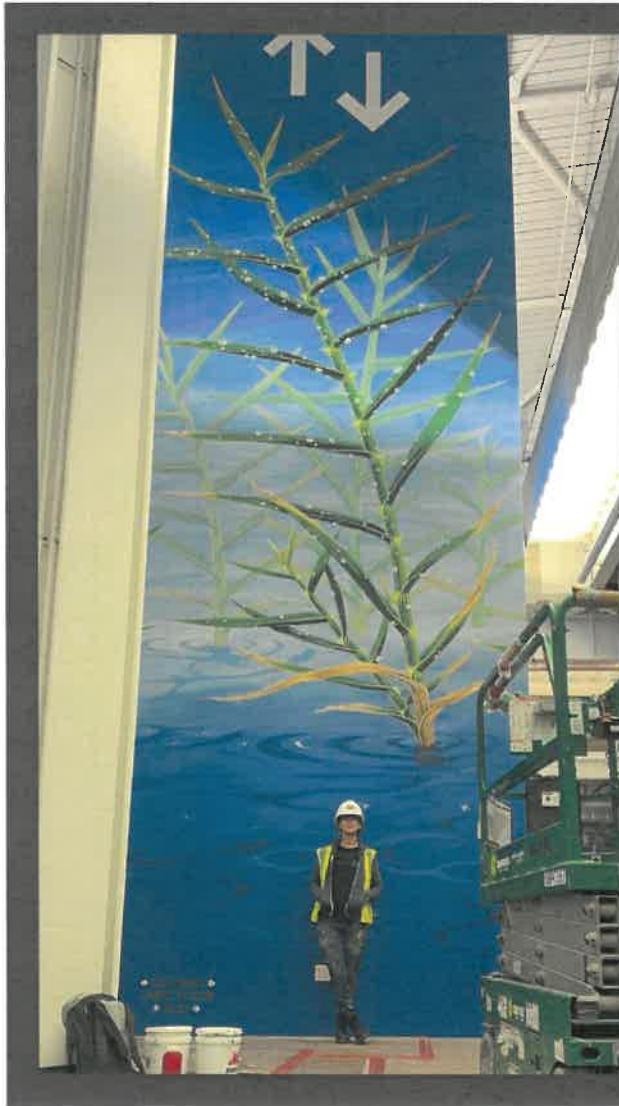
